Ed Fund Hosts a Round Table Event with Leadership Institute Fellows and Policy Makers to Discuss the Policy Implications of Classroom-Based Research on Student Learning

(SAN FRANCISCO, CA) The San Francisco Education Fund will host a round table forum between teacher leaders in San Francisco public schools and education policy makers. This conversation will focus on policies that could improve public schools at the school, district, and state levels. The panel and audience interaction will lead to stronger connections between policy formation and implementation, with this forum bringing the voices of teachers into the process that creates policies for public schools.

The event will be held at San Francisco City Hall in Room 416 on Thursday, December 1, from 5:00 PM – 7:00 PM.

This event between teacher leaders and policy makers is aimed at strengthening the links between the policies that directly impact student learning and the classroom implementation of those policies. Leadership Institute Fellows will share their classroom-based, action research, discuss how their research has improved their own teaching practice, and look at policies that could be created based on their research.

“This round table form is a unique opportunity for professionals inside schools who are charged with implementing policy to interact with those who set the policies about what works best for San Francisco’s students. Only through interactions like this one can we really improve public schools,” said the Ed Fund’s Executive Director Hugh Vasquez.

The Leadership Institute strives to strengthen the teacher voice in the education policy formation process.
